COMING EVENT

Starting April 1 a petition campaign will begin to hopefully solve two neighborhood issues.

First is the problem with short-term rentals. Some of the houses in Willow Pointe are being used as short-term rentals and this is harmful to the neighborhood, especially when the house is used for parties attracting large numbers of guests. You do not want to live close to one of these events. To put a stop to this activity we have to change the wording in our legal documents. To do this we must get 393 of the 588 property owners to sign a petition.

Second, is the problem of speeding and "cut-through" traffic. The connecting streets from the toll road and Jones Road are being used as short cuts by some people. We also have people speeding through our neighborhood, endangering walkers, bicycle riders and our kids. Harris County has a petition process to lower speed limits in neighborhoods.

Please plan to sign the petitions.
